NEWS FROM THE CHAIR

As I sit down to write this piece for the Autumn/Winter Newsletter, I am struck by how fast this year has gone. Summer doesn't seem that long ago but Christmas is just around the corner! We start the festive season with our hugely successful and enjoyable Christmas Bazaar on Saturday 23rd

November, held this year at the United Reform Church Hall in Caterham starting at 10.00am. There will be lots of festive and craft stalls, light bites and cakes, Christmas gifts and the big raffle. Do come along to support our fundraising for the hospital. Don't forget we sell a great range of Christmas cards from our Friends shop in the reception area of the hospital, only £2.00 for a pack of 5 high quality cards.

It has been a very busy time at the hospital this year with the Minor Injuries Unit (MIU) reporting they seem to be as popular as ever! A big change for MIU has been they are now able to see children over 5 years old, whereas in previous years they could only see adults. If you have been in the hospital recently you will have noticed the protective desk screens have been removed from the main reception desk and the Friends shop, after the hospital's Infection Control team deciding the screens were no longer required.

Our AGM in the early summer was well attended with Julie Phillips, the service manager for bed-based care at the hospital, providing an update of all the great work that is being done. Julie also announced that she was retiring from the hospital, and we wish her a long and happy retirement.

Also at the AGM we welcomed Bernice Frith as a new trustee of Friends. Bernice has lived in Caterham for over 30 years with her husband Chris, while bringing up their two daughters. Bernice is a regular volunteer in our Friends shop. Sadly, the AGM marked the retirement of Helen Denton as a trustee of the Friends. Helen had been a trustee for 10 years and stepped down as Chair last year. We thanked her for her hard work and dedication.

We have received several very kind donations from local residents and organisations, and I would like to specifically thank Sonia Fowler's estate who left Friends a significant sum, and the Miller Centre who recently donated £800.

I must also say a big thank you to all our fundraisers who have been very busy this year. Our fundraising events have included two very successful quiz nights, a street collection, a car boot sale and a stall at Caterham Carnival. Our hospital shop continues to be very popular and is a major source of income for us, so thank you to our dedicated shop volunteers. Due to our successful fundraising activities we have been able to purchase more specialist equipment for the hospital, including four new spot monitors that immediately provide the nurses with a patient's vital signs, as well as other equipment and furniture as requested by the hospital. NEW PURCHASES FOR THE HOSPITAL

We have purchased four Spot Monitors; major time saving pieces of equipment for nurses that record a patients vital signs - blood pressure, temperature, pulse & oxygen levels. It can raise an alarm if the pre-programmed levels are not achieved and it also has an escalation programme for actions to be taken in the event readings are outside of normal limits. Results are recorded directly to the patients record by WiFi which is a huge time saver and helps improve nursing efficiency and accuracy of patient records.





Four chairs have been purchased for the new Quiet Room, where staff are able to have private conversations with patients &/or patient families, or where patients can use for a quiet period. They have antibacterial surfaces and costed a total of £1,180.

A Zebra Printer, printing specialist labels with trace codes provides specific patient information that is attached to samples, as they move between various hospital departments. Total cost £386.



NEWS FROM THE HOSPITAL

The Minor Injuries Unit (MIU) is doing really well. We are now seeing children over 5 who attend with minor injuries. We have, as a service, been extremely busy over the summer months with none of the usual let up which comes with the better weather, hence our waiting times have increased at times.

We no longer have a GP working with us in the MIU so we are completely nurse led again. We have had several new staff join our team and we now have a practice development practitioner who is training our assessment nurses to become the practitioners of the future. We are also hoping to add a first contact physio practitioner to our team in the near future.

The wound dressing clinic is still running and is always busy with patients needing dressing changes.

We continue to grow and expand as a service, we have received really good feedback via our friends and family feedback service. We have also had some 'constructive' feedback which enables us to improve the service further for our patients. We have recently updated the website in light of some of these comments.
